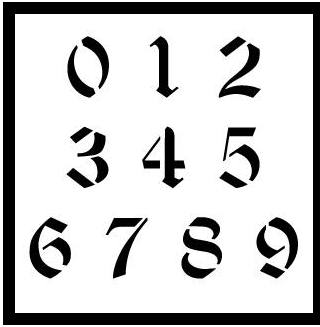


10 Questions, A Few Numbers + A Prize-Winning Diagram!
